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
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FOUNDER'S MESSAGE






Imagine Scholar University Graduation

What South Africa do we want to live in, and how do we take tangible steps to make that a reality?

Our work in the rural Nkomazi region of Mpumalanga is founded on the deep belief in the power of a community of extraordinary individuals working together towards something larger than themselves: Enacting a new story of community development. 





HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAMMES

Our outreach programme provides critical foundational skills and mindsets through light touch programmes. We invite deeply engaged participants to join our personal coaching programme, which takes place at local schools for two hours a week. In these sessions, we focus on cultivating their dedication, accountability, and sincere commitment to challenge themselves.

The most passionate, committed students are invited to our intensive on-campus programme, a comprehensive 26-hour weekly commitment. We are not looking for academic achievers but those demonstrating genuine enthusiasm for hard work and personal growth. This stage combines hands-on, experiential learning with coaching to enhance critical thinking, creativity, and problem-solving skills. By integrating project-based learning and ideation training, we enable young individuals to transform ideas into tangible outcomes. Students balance their time with local public school attendance, embedding a robust sense of individual agency, excellence, and identity.

A WEEK IN THE LIFE OF AN IMAGINE SCHOLAR


How a student spends their 26 hours a week at Imagine Scholar

DAY	SESSION	WHAT/WHY
Tuesday 2 hours	Critical Thinking	Utilising chess and complex board games, students learn a strategic thinking protocol that can be applied to all areas of life.
Wednesday 2 hours	Executive Coaching	A deep dive into personal success planning in an intimate coaching session tailored for navigating life's complexities.
Thursday 2 hours	Leadership Projects at Schools	Students take the lead in introducing the Imagine Scholar culture and toolkit through programmes at their local secondary schools.
Friday 2 hours	Idea Lab	Students become thinkers and doers, solving intriguing problems through entrepreneurship in action. They conceptualise, create, and run projects.
Saturday 9 hours	Holistic Wellness & Meta- Learning	Dedicated to holistic well-being, encompassing mindfulness, physical health activities, meta-learning sessions, reading time, technology training, and opportunities for external projects.
Sunday 9 hours	Student- Directed Growth	With full agency and control, students plan a day of pursuing personal passions and academic growth, fostering a sense of ownership over their development.



CURRICULUM SPOTLIGHT: META-LEARNING

In South Africa, achieving success in grade 12 exams and university graduation is paramount, yet rural students face significant disparities in these crucial areas. The conventional response advocates for more resources, intensified studying, and enhanced teacher training. At Imagine Scholar, we propose a more efficient and impactful solution: meta-learning.





Meta-learning, at its essence, is the art of learning how to learn. In this weekly session, youth come to understand how their brains work, how long-term memories are formed, and what evidence-based learning strategies work. They explore how habits are formed, the power of mindsets, how to plan their time, and even more importantly, how to analyse their results to modify their systems each term. Ultimately they practice systematic and strategic thinking, resulting in agency over their learning. This transformative approach has positioned Imagine Scholar students among the nation's top performers. 19

RICK'S STORY: META-LEARNING IN ACTION



After joining Imagine Scholar in 2018, Rick was a typical student without a structured approach to optimising his studies or achieving his academic ambitions. Coming from a public high school, he lacked the strategies necessary for academic success. However, through our meta-learning curriculum, Rick developed personalised systems that allowed him to comprehend his cognitive processes and employ effective learning techniques, which led to continuous academic growth. Embracing the mindset of learning how to learn, rather than solely focusing on what to learn, proved to be a pivotal shift for Rick. It unlocked his potential, igniting a drive for excellence in his academic pursuits.

Our firm conviction rests on the belief that potential is evenly spread throughout the world. This truth is vividly exemplified in rural communities, as evidenced by Rick's remarkable journey. Despite attending a local high school with a modest 60% matric pass rate, Rick emerged as the top student across all government schools in South Africa in 2021. His outstanding achievements, including perfect scores of 100% in Math, Physics, and Accounting, underscore his unwavering commitment to academic excellence. Rick's drive stems from an intrinsic ethic of excellence, fueling his relentless pursuit of knowledge and success. UNITED WORLD COLLEGE (UWC) STORY

The United World Colleges (UWC) are an international network of 18 prestigious secondary schools located around the globe. Their mission is to use education as the force to unite people, nations, and cultures for peace and a sustainable future. Each year, around 5 students from South Africa are accepted. Since 2017, Imagine Scholar has had 14 students accepted to attend their schools around the world on full scholarships, totaling over R14,000,000.

The area we serve has an approximate population of 300,000, which is about .003% of the population of South Africa. From our small community, we have produced roughly 20% of the students accepted to UWC since 2017.





PROMISE'S STORY

Promise's journey began as a member of the inaugural class of Imagine Scholar students in 2010. Following her graduation from the programme, she dedicated a year as an intern, actively supporting the development of future Scholars. During a gap year spent volunteering at an early childhood centre in Germany, she deepened her commitment to community service. This experience inspired her to pursue a degree in Clinical Medical Practice at the University of Pretoria. Promise discovered her passion for healthcare throughout her university years, particularly in addressing the complex issues confronting rural healthcare systems.

In line with our vision for a transformed Nkomazi, Promise initiated a low-cost health clinic in Kamhlushwa. The clinic provides high-quality, private healthcare services at accessible rates. Promise shared, "Opening this clinic means I have realised my dream of giving back to my community. I hope to bring people a step closer to trusting our health care system and health care workers."

Through the years, Promise has served as a board member for Imagine Scholar and an exemplary alumnus. Her unwavering dedication to the mission has been instrumental in shaping our organisation's identity. She epitomises the leadership qualities we strive to cultivate and showcases the profound impact our network can achieve. Promise's initiative is a testament to our collective mission of empowering individuals to drive positive change within their communities.

With a deep-seated passion for making a meaningful impact in his community, Prince embarked on his professional journey by serving as an IT lecturer at a college in Pretoria after graduation. In this role, he dedicated himself to imparting his skills and knowledge to the next generation of computer scientists, contributing significantly to the development of future tech leaders.

Driven by a desire to broaden his horizons and contribute to larger-scale societal change, Prince transitioned to a new role as a Functional Specialist at the South African Revenue Services. Here, he leverages his expertise and experience to navigate complex challenges and contribute to the efficient functioning of a critical governmental agency.


CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE: INNOVATION HALL OPENS


